What "school" were you in?

I was in Occupational. I went to Tech School for electronics. I didn't like it much then, because I wasn't sure it was what I really wanted to do.



Were you in any school activities?

I was pretty rebellious in school. I didn't participate in any organized activities. I

did, however, help to organize the first real rock concert at Bensalem High, headlining my band, Nova Star, and the bands Pepe (Marc Pepe's band) and The Breeze.

Who were your favorite or most influential teacher(s)?

Shirley Shiner was pretty influential, although I know she never thought she was. She always told me I could be anything I wanted to be. I always replied that I knew that, and that I was going to be a rock star. It frustrated her, but she was right, and I have done everything I've wanted to do. Mr. Schutter was also very encouraging. I always knew he truly cared about my future.

What did you do after BHS?

I joined the Air Force in 1979. I went into intelligence as a Cryptologic Linguist. I learned to read, write, and speak Arabic, and collected, translated, and ana-

lyzed intelligence data. I flew reconnaissance missions in the Mediterranean and got out of the service after 4-1/2 years. I took college courses, and got close to completing my degree in Business Administration. I never quite finished college, because my career took off more quickly than I thought it would. I was promoted through the ranks and had less and less time for school. I took my first Vice President position in 2000 as VP of Distribution for a company in New York City. That job taught me the value of a balanced life, and I left that career for one that allowed me more time to pursue my real passion, writing, and to actually have a life.

Besides *The Pict*, have you written other books?

I've started five different books. *The Pict* was my first success. I'm almost finished with my second novel, *Jerusalem Falls*, which I'll publish in 2010. It's set in 13th century Europe and Jerusalem. It's full of Templar Knights, crusades, inquisitors, conflict, drama, and eventually, resolution.

When *Jerusalem Falls* is published, I'll go back and complete the expanded version of *The Pict*, to make it into what it was originally intended. I'm looking forward to that, because it's the story that's closest to my heart.


